



The Remote Curriculum



Will my child be taught broadly the same curriculum as they would if they were in school?



We teach the same curriculum remotely as we do in school wherever possible and appropriate. However, we have needed to make some adaptations in some subjects. See website for curriculum overviews.

Remote teaching and study time each day



How long can I expect work set by the school to take my child each day?



We continue to follow our normal school timetable and have made slight adjustments, therefore expect pupils to start at 8.30am for form and finish at 3pm after period 5. The timetable for the day can be found on the school website.

Accessing remote education



How will my child access any online remote education you are providing?

All of the remote learning can be accessed through Microsoft Teams which your child has an account for. To access Teams, your child simply needs to sign in to RM Unify using their school login credentials.



If my child does not have digital or online access at home, how will you support them to access remote education?



If your child cannot access work on Teams please email Ms Melton (n.melton@osborne.coop) to request a paper based work pack to be sent to you. This work can then be sent back to the school for feedback.

How will my child be taught remotely?

Live lessons

Majority of lessons will be taught on Teams as the teacher is 'live' working with pupils. Throughout these lessons pupils **MUST** have their cameras turned off.



Education websites

Resources from the Oak Academy, BBC Bitesize and other online platforms will be used in lessons and can also be independently accessed by pupils.



Recorded lessons

Some lessons will be pre-recorded by the teacher and uploaded to Teams with audio instructions as an assignment for pupils to work through at their own pace.



Online assessment

GCSEPod, Hegarty Maths, Seneca etc. assist with learning and assessing pupil knowledge and understanding. Available online and on mobile phones and tablets



Self guided work

Some assignments will be set with resources for pupils to work through independently. If help is required pupils can message their teacher on Teams chat.



Paper packs

As outlined above, for any pupils with device issues a weekly work pack can be sent home to ensure pupils have equal access to the curriculum.



Engagement and feedback



What are your expectations for my child's engagement and the support that we as parents and carers should provide at home?



We expect pupils to engage with all remote learning and expect parents to support with this to the fullest extent possible e.g. setting daily routines to support your child's education.



How will you check whether my child is engaging with their work and how will I be informed if there are concerns?



Teachers will summarise the engagement of all pupils with the work at the end of the week. Each HOY will then use this information to coordinate phone calls home for pupils not engaged with the learning.



How will you assess my child's work and progress?



Pupils will be assessed fortnightly for core subjects and once every 3 weeks for non-core subjects using online platforms e.g. Microsoft Forms, Hegarty Maths. Traditional teacher assessments will also continue.
